

Tour of Toronto, Niagara and Montreal

Day 1: Airport Pickup



Take your Flight from the assigned airport to Toronto. After clearing customs, you are greeted by your bilingual tour director, who will remain with you throughout your stay.

Day 2: Explorations with Tour Director



An expert local guide will show you the highlights of Toronto on today's tour. Stroll through the shops of Chinatown; admire the old provincial government buildings and sweeping lawns of Queen's park. See the University of Toronto- the first electric heart pacemaker was developed herein 1922. Visit St. Lawrence market, a vibrant marketplace that was originally erected to serve as the first City Hall. Wind your way to Toronto harbour and 10-acre waterfront. Take in the sights and sounds of Queens Quay, which features picnicking, arts, music, markets, and yacht watching.

Visit CN Tower – Board a glass elevator and ascend to the top of Toronto's 1815-foot-high landmark for a dizzying view of the city. See if you can muster up the courage for a few steps across the glass floor of the observation deck as you peer down at the miniature world below.

Visit the Ontario Science Centre – Visit the Ontario Science Centre, built to honour Canada's centennial in 1967. More than 800 interactive exhibits highlight scientific exploration, research, and discovery—from the depths of the sea to the nebulous infinity of outer space. Test the laws of velocity and inertia on a simulated Olympic bobsled race, reach out and touch the whirling vortex of a volcano, and experience larger than life imagery at the centre's Omnimax Theatre! Around every corner, you will witness the breath of humankind's greatest discoveries and technological advances.

Day 3: Full Day Excursion to Niagara Falls



On Today's excursion, witness the breathtaking spectacle of Niagara Falls. With 70,000 gallons of water cascading down every second, Niagara could power the largest hydroelectric plant in the U.S. The first adventurer to survive a journey over the falls in a barrel did so in 1901; the practice was officially outlawed 60 years later. You will get a close-up look at the falls from abroad the maid of the mist (seasonal); alternatively, experience 'Behind the Falls' which enables you to get an equally close perspective as you stand on a platform behind the thundering waterfall.

Day 4: Transfer to Montreal



Arrive in Montreal, the second largest French speaking City in the World. On a tour of old city, learn about Montreal's 350 years, French influenced history, which began with the founding of a Christian mission. Glance at the clock on the nearby sulpician Seminary; it's the oldest public time piece in the North America. Stroll through Ville-Marie, site of Montreal's original European settlement, and into the Old Port of Montreal Harbour. End up amidst the festive bustle of place Jacques Cartier. Named after the French navigator who first sailed down the St. Lawrence River into Canada it is the site of the City's oldest market.

Day 5: Guided Sightseeing of Montreal



Enjoy a guided tour of the cultural and historical highlights of Montreal. See the Basilica of Notre-Dame-de-Montreal, a magnificent example French Canadian architecture that once hosted national separatist rallies. With your expert local guide, you'll then ascend Mont Royal to the expansive green park at its summit, designed by American landscape architect Fredrick Law Olmstead mastermind of New York City's Central Park. The 30-metre cross at its peak commemorates the 1643 climb by de Maisonneuve, founder Montreal.

Visit to McGill University – Learn more about the Canadian system of higher education when you visit McGill University, One of the four major universities in Montreal.

Evening Activity – Tonight you will enjoy an evening activity in Montreal. You might spend the night playing Laser Quest, an action laser tag game, or experience an IMAX movie. You may be familiar with IMAX, but did you know that the IMAX motion picture projection system was invented by a group of Canadian filmmakers and entrepreneurs? They created the first IMAX for Montreal EXPO'67. (Evening activity is subject to change. The activity will be pre-booked based on availability and cannot be changed on tour.)

Day 6: Excursion to La Ronde Amusement Park --



Enjoy a day of thrills and excitement at La Ronde Amusement Park, Canada's second largest amusement park. Opened in 1967 as part of EXPO '67, the park now boasts 39

rides, including nine roller coasters; among them Le Monstre, which currently holds the record as the world's highest double tracked roller coaster.

Day 7: Visit to the Biodome and Olympic stadium Observation Deck--



Explore the Biodome, an intriguing environmental museum that scientifically replicates four ecosystems: a Laurentian forest with a functioning beaver lake, the St. Lawrence marine environment, polar region housing a penguin community, and a tropical forest inhabited by more than 1,000 fishes, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. Today you will also zoom 188 metres into the air in just 95 seconds aboard a funicular to the observation deck of Montreal's Olympic stadium for incredible views of the city and its surroundings. The tower leans at a 45-degree angle and offers visibility that stretches over 56 Kilometres on a clear day. The stadium itself was built for the 1976 Olympic Games and features six swimming pools, including one with an adjustable bottom.

Day 8: Back home with memories to cherish

Your Tour Director assists with the transfer to the airport, where you'll check in for your return flight home. You will arrive home on **Day 9**.
